# For the Record . . .

The Mueller Co. has the distinction of having the country's earliest newsletter for its employees, beginning with its first issue November 1, 1910.

The first newsletter was a "secret" one, published Mr. & Mrs. Walter T. Morey only for the eyes of the Mueller salesmen and included Family~\$25 trade industry information, salesmen's tips and new products offered by the company.

Later, this newsletter or booklet was given to all employees and always included something that made the reader say, "Gee, I didn't know that."

We have compiled a few of those tidbits from past issues of the newsletter:

"A man down about Macon writes a letter to the Herald in explanation of the excessive rainfalls which have inundated Illinois this fall. He blames it on the radio. He says the radio keeps the atmosphere charged with the same kind of electricty as lightning, thus throwing back the moisture as fast as it condenses." ~ November 1926

"... The world should recline its vast head on the first convenient pillow and take an age-long nap." (Nathaniel Hawthorne) ~ November 1932

"[A baby's] nails until he is a year old must be bitten off instead of pared or he will steal when he grows up." ~ March 1936

"Tell a person to write his age on a piece of paper." Tell him to multiply it by two. Then have him add five to that, and multiply the total by 50. Tell him to subtract the number of days in the year (365) from that. Now have him count any change under a dollar in his pocket, and add that. Then ask him to tell you the total, and promise to tell him his correct age, and the amount of change, if his arithmetic is right. When he gives you the total, mentally add 115. The total of that will give his age in the first two figures and the amount of change in the latter two." ~ March 1937 (This works!)

### All Skate!



# Do You Remember?

Mueller Co. gave the gift of a tract of land containing approximately 17 acres to the Decatur Park District. The land involved lies south of the Borg-Warner property and Route 51 south of the City of Decatur. Harlan A. White, president, presented the gift to Verne Roby, park district board president. The new gift is the second property transaction between the Mueller Co. interests and the park district. In 1925 Adoph Mueller presented 27 acres of land for the park at Broadway and Lake Shore Dr. that now bears his name.—Mueller Newsletter, December, 1974
