

Museum observes 5th anniversary

For the Record . . .

On Tuesday, May 5, the biggest green and yellow truck I've ever seen pulled into the parking lot in front of the Hieronymus Mueller Museum.

Ten minutes later, the oldest car I've ever seenwas lowered from the ramp and pushed in through the new doors of the museum to its brick road in front of Hieronymus' enlarged photograph.

It looked like it belonged.

The car, which may or may not be a Mueller Motor Carriage, is being loaned to the museum for three years by its owner, Mr. James Renzulli, an antique car collector from San Diego.

Mr. Renzulli found the car almost 30 years ago leaning against an old shed in Independence, CA. He asked the owner, Mr. Joseph Troglin, if he could buy the car. The owner told him to get off his property. Mr. Renzulli visited the old car several times over the past 30 years, always being told the car was not for sale.

In 1996, Mr. Troglin's daughter called Mr. Renzulli and asked him if he still wanted to buy the car. Mr. Renzulli said yes.

The wheels and hubs were gone, but a leather #7 remained with the motor carriage.

Mr. Renzulli did not know what the car was, but started renovating it and added a one-cylinder engine so he could show it in one-cylinder car shows.

When he entered the show at Torrey Pines, "someone" said it looked like a Mueller car. He entered it as a Mueller car and had won several awards with this beautiful blue car which is dated from 1896 to 1900.

We have worked the last three years on trying to authenticate the carriage. We have not been able to. But we did get Mr. Renzulli to loan it to the museum.

It is now surrounded by old photographs, old blueprints, drawings and items from old magazines. We cannot say for sure this is a Mueller-made motor carriage, although the blueprints we have in storage indicate Hieronymus and his sons made at least eight. We hope this is the 7th.

It has drawn quite a bit of attention and is a unique addition to the museum. Come see it!
